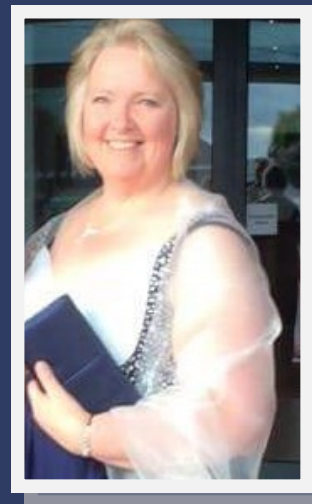

Just a few lines to introduce myself and ask for your vote in the by-election in the Halsdon Ward on Thursday 14th April.

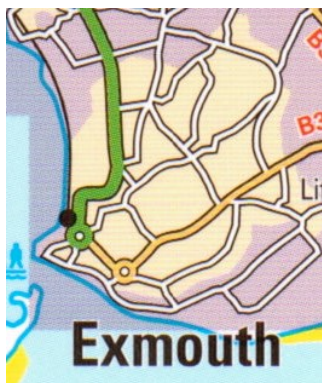

There will be a meeting for all the residents in Halsdon Ward after that, to hear and to listen **YOUR** views. The results will be delivered to every house with another questionnaire. This will give **LOCAL** people the opportunity to **HAVE A SAY** in how **YOU** want Exmouth to develop. We believe we should provide homes, create a vibrant economy for the future, to create jobs for all ages and provide the service infrastructure we all need.

This has to be within the East Devon Local Plan as agreed by an Independent inspector in January 2016.

DINAN WAY LINK ROAD

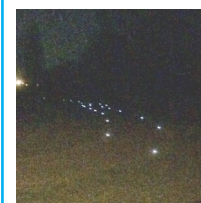
Your Conservative Councillors have welcomed the decision by Devon County Council to construct the Link Road for Dinan Way to access Exeter Road. This will relieve many Halsdon Roads from the constant traffic using our roads as 'rat runs' and make it safer for everyone using Gipsy Lane and Marpool Hill.

 The Town Council employs "a man with a van" to help keep the Town tidy and maintain a vast number of things around the town. The Council has bought a bowser to attach to its vehicle for the watering all our wonderful flowers and beds provided by the Britain in Bloom volunteers.

Conservative Exmouth Town Councillors have consistently expressed the many different views of the residents to East Devon District Council on the proposed Queens Drive Development. It has to represent all those who object, those who support and to make a judgement on the 'silent' majority'. The area is the car park, golf, jungle fun and fun park. It will NOT encroach over the Maer or The Cricket club, Tennis Courts, Madeira bowling club and amusements will remain. The land is owned by EDDC. The pavement alongside the Beach will remain.

The Annual Town Meeting made a decision to have a 'Town Poll' on the matter to express these views. This view is already expressed in the minutes of the Town Council.
